MAKE AND DO!

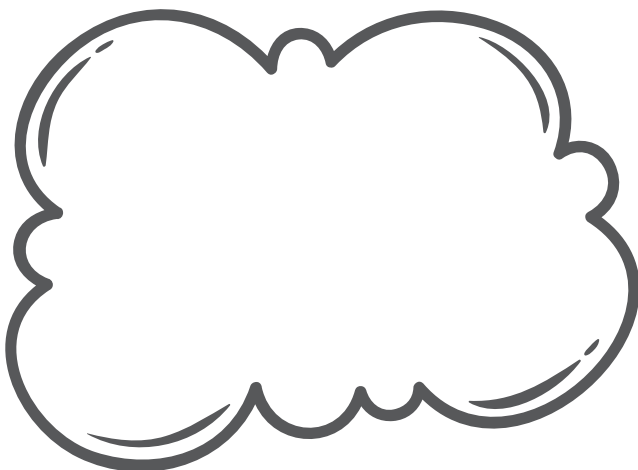
The spanish verb **hacer** can be translated as either **to make** or **to do**. This means it can be really confusing to choose the right verb.

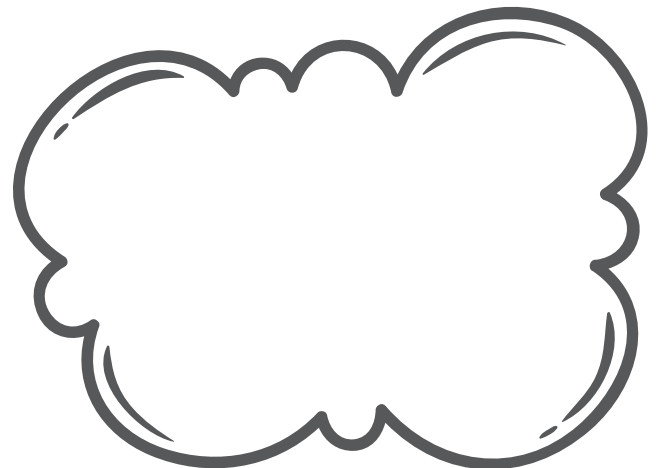
